The Bryan Jerrard Award 2023

The Bryan Jerrard Award is given annually for what the judges believe to be the best published article on an aspect of Gloucestershire's history during the past year. It is named after Bryan Jerrard, who was Chairman of the Gloucestershire Rural Community Council's Local History Committee (the predecessor of the Gloucestershire Local History Association) between 1978 and 1998.
