Forum 8 September

The third of this year's four Forums was held on 8 September when John Chandler gave an excellently illustrated and wide-ranging talk on *From village carrier to National Express: the local history of Gloucestershire public transport.*

John also presented the Bryan Jerrard Award for 2024 to Nigel Costley who received the prize on behalf of Steven Carter who was unfortunately unable to attend. Steven's article 'Coleford's Jovial Foresters' in The New Regard 39 is available for reading on our website and was judged to have met all the requirements that writing local history should attain. The runner up was Terry Moore-Scott's 'The Manor, Hamlet and Tithing of Broadwell in Leckhampton' published in Leckhampton Local History Society Research Bulletin 6. We thank The History Press for their continued support in providing the prizes.
