Items added to GlosDocs in the last quarter include:-

The Neville Crawford Photographic Collection: Many topics relating to local history and industrial archaeology are represented in this collection of just over 1000 images.

The Harry Townley Photographic Collection: Nearly 500 images of the industrial heritage of Gloucestershire, featuring transport history and milestones.
